




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Bargello Quilts with a Twist – Supplies list

Basic sewing supplies (including thread, pins, scissors and seam ripper)
Sewing machine in good working order
Extension cord
Iron and small ironing board (unless provided by workshop host)
Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler (6" x 24" Omnigrid recommended)
Batting for work-wall for classes lasting two or more days
Notebook, pencil and colored pencils

Book recommended but not required – *Bargello Quilts with a Twist* by Maggie Ball (Krause Publications, 2008). Books are available for purchase from Maggie at class and through her on-line store on the website.

Fabric quantities are those needed to make the 16 blocks that we'll work on during the workshop. Finished 16-block quilt with borders is approximately 36" x 36". If you'd like to make a bigger quilt with 36, or 64 blocks, or you are taking this class for 2 or more days, you'll need additional fabric...

- 8-10 fabrics – $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$ yard pieces. Include a wide range of values from light to dark. A variety of print scales is also good. If you have trouble choosing, start with a multicolored theme print and add fabrics to go with it. Try to avoid a completely monochromatic selection unless you include black or white.

Option – select a project from the book and substitute your own fabric choices. Fabric requirements for the projects are listed in the book.
